PARK NICOLLET MAPLE GROVE CLINIC & SPECIALTY CENTER

The Park Nicollet Maple Grove Clinic and Specialty Center was a two phase project under General Contractor Ryan Companies. The project kicked off in June of 2014.

The Park Nicollet Maple Grove Clinic and Specialty Center was design-build with Dunham providing schematic guidelines. An emphasis was placed on energy efficiency through the design process. Some highlights include magnetic bearing centrifugal chillers, high efficiency boilers, water saving flush valves and controls setback strategies. Park Nicollet took part in a custom rebate program with Xcel Energy that included a \$70,000 incentive with an estimated \$45,000 annual energy cost savings.

The first phase consisted of a three story, 92,000 SF medical office building. The medical office building offers a wide range of services including an urgent care center, TRIA Orthopaedic Center, a pharmacy and imaging.

The second phase of the project kicked off after completion of the medical office building in November of 2015. The second phase consisted of a one story, 30,000 SF surgery center. This phase was a gut and remodel of the existing clinic with a link connecting the two buildings. The surgery center includes two functioning operating rooms, endoscopy department, sterile processing department and staff break rooms for the entire campus. Some shell space still remains in the building with plans for two more ORs and their associated pre/post rooms.

All utilities for surgery center are fed through the link from the mechanical room in the medical office building. Laminar flow OR ceilings were provided and installed by MMC. There were a couple unusual obstacles in this phase of the project. The City of Maple Grove required all unused underground piping to be filled so future remodels would not tie into a dead line. We hired Axel Ohman to fill all existing waste with concrete that was fluid enough to fill small pipes but had a quick set time. The existing rain water system posed another issue as it was undersized and did not meet Minnesota's plumbing code. We worked with Park Nicollet and the structural engineer to work around that issue and avoid added costs to up size rain water leaders.

The project was a full team effort from beginning to end. Every team member from preconstruction to owner training and turnover contributed to securing and delivering a successful project. Construction Executive and Vice President Mark Sigel, Project Manager Matt Wangerin, Assistant Project Manager Alex Wolf, Pipefitting Foreman Jesse Wredberg, Plumbing Foreman Mark Montgomery, Sheet Metal Foreman Greg Steinert (phase 1), Sheet Metal Foreman Jim Laudenbach (phase 2), Design Engineers Jamie Stark and Mark Bye, BIM Coordinators Joe Gardell, Eric Wolf and Cesar Sarzoza, Start-up Technician Mike DeJuliannie and Project Accountant Jessica Matelsky.


Fairview Ridges Hospital Community Golf Benefit




THREE SISTER COMPANIES. ONE AMAZING ARENA.

Three APi Group sister companies are teaming up to build one amazing arena for the Milwaukee Bucks. Grunau, MMC and Modulus MEP combined their talents and expertise to win the project with Mortenson. Construction has already begun on the 714,000 square foot multi-purpose arena which is slated to be complete in time for the 2018-19 NBA season.
